Animals Through the Years

As we celebrate CASA's 25th Anniversary, we reminisce about the animals who have come through the shelter's doors. While each situation is unique, the underlying theme is always the same, i.e., CASA fulfills the mission of "Bringing together animals in need and caring people, forever enriching their lives."

Most of our cats and dogs come to the shelter, are cared for and soon find loving homes. Looking back, however, we remember the special animals featured in the newsletters including: animals requiring surgery, needy mothers and those who stayed at CASA for a long, long time. Each one came to the shelter and touched the hearts of many before leaving.

Three memorable cats are Lenny, Snowden and Harley. Lenny was hit by a car and had extensive injuries. After many surgeries and a very long recovery he was adopted. Lenny had the will to live despite all his trials. Snowden had two broken legs and a fractured pelvis and Harley required surgery for a tumor. Surgeries such as these have been funded by special fundraisers, grants and community-based programs such as SC Giving Tuesday.

Nanae - mother of nine arrived emaciated.

Memorable mothers include Nanae and Misha. Nanae, severely underweight and her jaw wired together, came to the shelter with her nine nursing puppies. NaeNae and all of her puppies found loving homes.

Misha, eight-plus years old gave birth to 12 puppies while in foster. Shortly after weaning them, she passed away from cancer but all of her puppies found homes.

Then there are the animals who waited a long time to be adopted, but eventually found forever homes. As a no-kill shelter, our animals stay as long as needed. Tetra, a young, brindle pit bull stayed at CASA for over a year. Once she was adopted, Tetra and her mom continued to visit CASA through the years. Tom, a cat with "catitude" suffered an injury resulting in a fusion of his damaged leg. He remained at CASA for over a year. Bruno, a stocky pitbull/Australian cattle dog was not a fan of boisterous or energetic dogs and outstayed his friend, Mac, at the shelter. Bruno remained at the shelter for well over a year until he was adopted. Bruno now comes to the Dog Wash annually.

Celebrating CASA's 25th Anniversary

We are celebrating the 25th anniversary of CASA, the Camano Animal Shelter Association. CASA, incorporated as a Washington non-profit in 1998 and as a non-profit charitable organization in 2000, is a no-kill shelter devoted to the care of homeless pets. Prior to 1998, long-time residents may remember that NOAH occupied the county-owned building on East Camano Drive and they contracted with Island County to care for impounded dogs and also to provide animal control services. This contract was not renewed when the septic system failed and the shelter had to be emptied. NOAH later moved on to become an adoption center in Stanwood.

FOREVER HOME

To fill the animal services void, CASA was formed and contracted with the county to provide temporary care, boarding and redemption services for impounded/seized dogs from Camano Island. CASA now accepts stray dogs and cats from Camano Island and owner-surrendered animals from Camano and beyond as space allows. CASA works with other shelters and rescue groups to find homes for needy animals.

When there was concern that the shelter might have to close due to lack of funds, the Friends of CASA was formed to raise funds and thanks to the community CASA's financial future was safe. Tegan Locker served as manager for 14 years setting the standards of care and instilling the willingness to go the extra mile for each animal that continues today. Currently a manager, five part-time staff and shelter volunteers care for the animals. Foster parents care for young animals or animals in need of time outside the shelter. A nine-member Board of Directors leads the organization and recently an Executive Director was hired.

Thanks to a bequest from Roberta Gill, a catio and a free-standing structure with clear, UV resistant roof panels was installed in the dog yard. This permits the light to come in and allows dogs to be in the yard every day. At the same time, a catio with solid lower walls (to keep the dogs from the cats) and upper wire screening allows the cats access to the outdoors in a safe secure enclosure. The kennel building improvements include: insulation, lighting and soundproofing. Glass kennels were donated in memory of Paul and Irene Leslie. Most recently, with newly acquired space, an Admin/Board office, Manager's Office and storage space were added. The front office and ISO were renovated and a new critter room created.

Computer systems such as PetPoint Shelter Management and Quick Books financials have been implemented. Our website, Facebook page, eNews and newsletter provide information about CASA in a timely fashion. To assist in transport, a van was purchased. Two washers and dryers work tirelessly to keep up with the wash.

As we celebrate CASA's anniversary, we take time to thank the staff and volunteers who have devoted so much time and effort over the years. Thanks also to the community who has generously donated funds to help the animals who come through our doors. We are proud of all that has been accomplished and look forward to the future. Happy anniversary to CASA!
