Message from the Executive Director

Spring has sprung at CASA! The daffodils are blooming in front of the building and the steady stream of pregnant cats coming through our doors reminds us kitten season has begun. Spring is just the start of the busy months ahead. Ensuring CASA was adequately staffed before kitten season was a top priority and I'm happy to announce we filled our empty positions and welcomed two new staff members in March. The reality of the day-today operations at CASA is we rely heavily on knowledgeable staff and volunteers to care for the animals and prepare them for their forever homes.

Since January we have opened our doors to 54 cats and 73 dogs and most have needed some level of medical care beyond the basics of spay/neuter, vaccines, microchips, and flea treatment. We never know what situation will arise or what an animal will need from us from one moment to the next. Your support is vital to funding our mission and helping dogs and cats like those you see in this newsletter.

Whether you are familiar with CASA or not, I invite you to get to know us better over the coming months. In February we launched CASA Connections, a monthly eNews to keep our community up-to-date on the ongoings and happenings of CASA. Keeping our community involved and connected helps spread the word and increase adoptions allowing us to intake more animals in need. We will be busy with fundraising events, our Spring Market in May, our community outreach events such as our free microchip clinic in April, and our Pet Food Drive at IGA in June. We hope to see you at one of the events supporting CASA; the donations we raise at these events are crucial to cover the increased cat and kitten medical costs and increased staff hours during kitten season. We have many exciting goals ahead of us and I hope you'll continue to support us in our venture.

The Long Wait

Imagine what Ricardo, Hachi, Dennis, and Deandra must be thinking as they sit at the shelter waiting to find their forever home. These dogs once had homes, but are now waiting patiently to be adopted. They came to the shelter in October and have been waiting since then (over five months). That is a long wait. It is difficult to understand why some dogs have to wait so long, while others come into the shelter and leave quickly.

Ricardo does have some placement restrictions, but there has to be someone who will meet him and give him a chance. "He is active, cuddly, devoted, loyal, and very intelligent. He could go to a home as an only dog or with other dog-friendly canines! He loves all people and would be okay with a confident dog-savvy cat." Both Ricardo and Hachi were transferred from another shelter due to space limitations.

Hachi is a big dog who loves people and life. "He is an active boy who loves to play and loves to go on walks. He does not realize he is a big guy, so he thinks he makes a great lap dog! One of his all-time favorite activities is car rides. He would do best in an adult-only home or with kids 8 and older. He does well with like-sized dogs, although he will need a home without small dogs or cats." One reason that Hachi may be overlooked is that when people come to the shelter looking, he just placidly sits there looking at them. He is not the "take me, take me" type of dog. We are hoping that when folks look into Hachi's eyes they see the lovable dog just waiting for his home.

Foster Parents Needed

Kitten season is upon us and CASA is recruiting foster parents! We have already had a few pregnant moms and kittens arrive at CASA. Most arrive and have a long wait before they will be fully vetted and available for adoption. Rather than staying at CASA, these cats would prefer to be in a foster home!

CASA sends motherless infant kittens, pregnant or nursing moms, and weaned kittens who are just not quite big enough into foster. Foster parents choose which animals they take and are provided all the supplies they need by the shelter. Fostering is fun for the foster family and is a huge help for the cats and kittens in need! Message from the Shelter Manager

CASA opens our doors to animals who sometimes would not be given a second chance. We often find ourselves taking in the dogs and cats that have been denied spaces elsewhere and working with other Western WA shelters by transferring dogs who have not been successful at their facilities. This opens kennel space for the larger open admission shelters, and hopefully drives down their euthanasia rates. Taking in the ones who need a little extra work and TLC leads to slower turnover for many of the dogs at CASA.

The longer stays can be stressful on the staff and the dogs, as we wonder when the right home will come along. Dogs who have been in the shelter system for a long time may become shut down, withdrawn or have increased behavioral issues. CASA relies on dedicated staff and volunteers to make the stay as positive as possible. Our intimate size allows us to work closely with these dogs daily and put in extra time exercising, socializing, marketing and matchmaking a perfect home. In some special cases, we reach out to other rescues for help in finding homes for our animals.

Happiness is an Indoor Cat

You love your cats. You want them to be healthy and happy, and to be with you for a long time. The best way to do that is to keep them inside your home. Indoor-only cats may live as many as 10 to 15 years longer than cats who are allowed to roam outdoors.

FOREVER HOME

Cats who live all or part of their lives outside face many risks: being hit by cars; being killed or injured by predators such as coyotes, eagles or a neighbor's dog; being trapped and dumped far away from home; being stolen and perhaps inhumanely treated; being deliberately or accidentally poisoned; and contracting serious or fatal diseases such as feline leukemia or feline infectious peritonitis.

The benefits to you, the owner, are also numerous. You will have healthier pets who need fewer visits to the veterinarian; your neighbors will appreciate you for ensuring that your cats are not fighting at night or digging in their flower beds; your cats will have few or no problems with fleas, worms or ticks; and your pets will never disappear and leave you wondering what happened to them and whether they will ever return. You will know that even in the wettest and coldest weather, your indoor cats are safe and warm, with access to clean and healthy food and water. You can put up a bird feeder in your yard, secure in the knowledge that your cats will not be able to kill the birds that you and they enjoy watching from inside.

Many of us wonder if we are depriving our cats of a "wildlife" experience by keeping them inside. It's important to remember that they are domestic animals, and lack the instincts and skills to live outside. Provide your indoor cats with a variety of toys, perches and scratching posts to provide the stimulation and exercise they need. If you still feel that an outside experience is beneficial, why not build a "catio?" This enclosure, usually accessible from inside the house, allows cats to be in a controlled outdoor environment where they are still safe.

With proper care, you can enjoy the company of your feline friends for many years.

Less Than Perfect

Meet Achilles, the poster child for animals who come with physical issues. Achilles has been adopted but the love he showed to the animals and anyone he met will long be remembered. His ears were infected by ear mites which caused hematomas that had to be drained. This in turn made folds in his ears. He wasn't born this way, but being an outdoor cat, the ear mites were able to thrive.

At birth, however, the umbilical cord wrapped around his left rear leg and caused part of it to come off. This is a very rare occurrence, but walking on three legs certainly doesn't slow Achilles down. We hope that Achilles reminds adopters that a "less than perfect" can really be the perfect animal for them.
